"The rest of mankind who were not killed by these plagues still did not repent of the work of their hands; they did not stop worshiping demons, and idols of gold, silver, bronze, stone and wood" – Revelation 9:20

We may wish there was a god who would magic away all of our problems. We may wish we could live without restraint. and this god would bless our lives. Of course, such a god does not exist. Instead. Christians believe, there is God who calls us to form our lives in His wisdom and love. This God works in and through our humanity, when we turn to Him, when we repent. In this God of Christian belief, there is glorious hope of a "new heaven and a new earth", but my, what trauma there is and will be until mankind does repent, learning the ways to this harmony of God, (wo)man and nature.

Welcome to the first article of the academic year. None of us could have predicted or envisaged what was to come when we started the Autumn term, in September 2019.

When the Government closed all schools in March, our school community rose to the many challenges with real courage and commitment. I was so impressed by the response of our entire school community and was overwhelmed by the work from everyone, as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, to ensure that the wheels kept turning. We have certainly learnt all about resilience.

Overnight, the school moved to an online learning platform which has changed our school forever. Teachers learnt how to record the learning to share with the children online and with the support of teaching assistants, each child was given regular feedback. At the same time, teachers and teaching assistants were also onsite providing childcare for vulnerable and key worker children, working through the holidays. You can see what school life was like during lockdown by looking at our website, twitter feed or Facebook page.

Our local governing body actively supported the school, attending

virtual meetings and adopting the mountains of paperwork and policies that were required. Our admin team navigated the numerous new online platforms and returns we were required to do for the Department for Education. Government food vouchers were organised for eligible families, food parcels delivered regularly and regular welfare calls made. The staff at Surrey Hills have been simply amazing.

'I just wanted to extend my thanks to you and all the staff at Surrey Hills School for the huge amount of work you have put in, to continue to engage and educate under challenging circumstances. The girls miss school desperately which is a tribute to the caring and thriving school environment you have nurtured. They are coping fairly well under lockdown and have proven to be fairly resilient learners too! They have responded well to the online learning and they love the feedback comments and rewards from staff. I am so grateful for all that you do, it is very much appreciated.' Mrs X

Children engage in motivating and achievable tasks and activities, at different times of the year and in almost all weathers! They work with tools, play, learn boundaries of behaviour; both physical and social, grow in confidence, self-esteem and motivation whilst developing an understanding of the natural world.

Working through practical problems and challenges helps children build confidence in decision making and evaluating risk whether this be designing a den, lighting a fire or making blackberry jam! Forest School is all about developing the children's characteristics of learning which are so vital for future success.



One of the most positive things throughout the pandemic lockdown, has been the way in which the village has acted as a community to support each other. The "Good Neighbour" Volunteers who stepped forward to support people in need of help with shopping and prescription collections, and the way in which the "baby meals" team has supported both new mums and babies as well as other families needing help, has been absolutely fantastic. but it is sad to see that some individuals have taken exception to these by tearing down the signs.

Many dog owners who I meet despair and comment that leaving dog poo everywhere gives ALL dog owners (wrongly) a bad name, and the non-dog owning population just get incensed particularly when poo is left outside their houses. Dog poo left lying around is a serious health hazard which can cause blindness in humans and is the reason why the WVA takes it seriously, and local councils can impose fines on offending humans.

Speeding and Noise Campaign

The WVA has continued to explore practical ways in which we can address the speeding problem through



the village, which unfortunately seems to have got worse with less traffic on the road. We are also

progressing actively the use of "Noise cameras" to record the motorbike noise levels which have also become intolerable especially on fine summer weekends.

It is possible that some council funding will be available to tackle the speeding issue but using new technology to tackle noise may be something which we have to look to

fundraise separately for. In the survey we conducted, many of you said you would be prepared to make a separate financial contribution on this. When we identify suitable technology, and after assessing the impact of the RIDE QUIETLY signs, we may decide this is something to pursue.

And some news in brief....

WVA AGM - is due to be held on 3rd October, but we will assess nearer the time whether we can do this in Holy Trinity or whether we do it virtually via Zoom.

Church Bank – is finally blooming, and further work will be done in the autumn to seed the bare patches, cut back the hazel along the road, remove the unwanted bracken, and attend to the hedge which was planted along Logmore Lane below the church. We will be planning a working party for this to which all help is welcomed.

Green Spaces – the Village's green spaces are there for the enjoyment of everyone, but please remember to consider neighbours when using them, and take all your rubbish away with you to dispose of at home.

Thanks to the public-spirited individual who removed the broken window pane in the bus stop and temporarily boarded it up. Can you let the WVA

in these things, it is worth noting that Surrey is in the process of considering changes to the two-tier council system of separate County and District councils. Mole Valley (with all other District Councils) and Surrey County Council have signalled the start of consultations on this – which will take some time to resolve – but which has important implications for residents. This is not new in England and Wales and many Counties have successfully moved to a "Unitary" structure to simplify the provision of council services.

shops, delivery vehicles potentially can have a positive environmental impact through the sharing of vehicle journeys compared to separate trips into town or further afield.

Sometimes this is a bonfire spoiling a family barbeque (or indeed the other way round) or it can be about loud parties or even threats and violence. If you do experience such behaviour, then most people feel safe to raise it with their neighbour directly – but unfortunately this is not always the case. So, what are your options then?

Firstly, if you think you are under immediate threat obviously call 999. If it is not immediate then call Surrey Police on 101.

Surrey Mediation Services (www. mediationsurrey.org) can offer help to resolve disputes through their Community Mediation service, including issues such as:

- Noise
- Anti-social behaviour
- Abuse or threatening behaviour
- Rubbish
- Parkina
- Tall trees or hedges
- Boundary disputes or access problems
- Children's behaviour
- Privacy
- Pets

Its aim is to avoid the need for lengthy and expensive legal proceedings. It is also more flexible as the law does not recognise all the issues arising between neighbours. However, trying mediation does not prevent you from using other procedures later if no agreement is reached.

If the property concerned is a Housing Association one then Clarion encourage residents to maintain a diary of events and to



contact them directly in each instance. Where residents want to copy these concerns to me, I am happy to follow them up with the housing association. My focus is always on resolving the root cause of whatever is leading to a perception of anti-social behaviour, including through whatever support the council team can give to either party involved.

Clarion have recently lost a case taken to the Ombudsman where they failed to respond appropriately and in essence allowed some anti-social behaviour to continue – to the detriment of their resident and to others around them. As a result, Clarion should now be more proactive in supporting these situations when they sadly arise.

No matter how well intentioned this act was, nevertheless the land there is not a public space and is in fact subject to a number of rules.

The space itself was subject to a lot of debate, after much detailed research from village residents, during the discussions and challenges around the creation of Pipp Brook Place and Meadow Close.



As a direct result of that work, the Planning Inspector included a specific condition on the developer to create a 10m buffer alongside the Pipp Brook at the eastern end of the site in order to support the natural diversity and ecosystems.

The Council's planning officers took action to preserve those ecosystems when the land was cleared and wrote to nearby residents to highlight the need for the area to be reinstated.

Support for New Business Ventures

Finally, a quick plug for the Council's Economic Development service. If through COVID-19 or whatever other circumstances, you are thinking of setting up a new business, starting out on your own, then the team can help.

THE HUT & THE READING ROOM UPDATE

Update on behalf of the Trustees of The Hut, the Trustees of the Reading Room and the partners of Dorking Medical Practice.



As with every aspect of life, the Covid-19 crisis

has had an impact on the speed with which the Trustees have been able to progress their plans for The Reading Room and for The Hut, not least because the NHS decision making processes have of necessity had to focus on more urgent priorities than the potential relocation of our surgery in Westcott.

I reported in April that the doctors at Dorking Medical Practice had been very clear in their wish to work with the Trustees towards the delivery of new medical premises in the centre of the village and they have certainly not lessened their efforts to press forward. The doctors have now had funding approved in principle by their NHS paymasters to produce the required business case for the retention of a practice in Westcott.

Additionally, the relevant NHS property manager has been in touch with Dorking Medical Practice's

architects to see if they can agree an outline specification for the size of premises which would be appropriate given the number of patients in and around the village and the NHS's own published intention to relocate some services which are currently provided in hospitals into local surgeries. My understanding is that they are close to agreement on the amount of space which would be needed.

The doctors have also commenced detailed work on their business case, which is heavily reliant on data which demonstrates the demand for clinical services in Westcott. All NHS surgeries are required to have a 'Patient Participation Group' ("PPG") to act as a feed-back/suggestions forum by patients to their doctors.

Dorking Medical Practice's existing PPG had only one member resident in Westcott and, at the suggestion of the Trustees, call for potential members of a 'Westcott sub-PPG' was helpfully put out mid-Covid by Holy Trinity Church and by Westcott Village Association to their respective email That quickly resulted in the successful recruitment by the doctors of a 'Westcott sub-PPG' specifically made up of people living in and

around Westcott.

The 'Westcott sub-PPG' has wasted no time in getting to work. By the time this magazine reaches you in print, all patients living in Westcott who attend any of Dorking Medical Practice's surgeries (including Riverbank), and all patients living outside Westcott who attend Riverbank, will have been asked by post or text message to respond to a survey put together by the doctors with the help of the 'Westcott sub-PPG' to assess the community need for a replacement surgery when Riverbank closes.

If the invitation to participate in the survey has somehow missed you, hard copies are available for collection from South Street surgery, from Riverbank and from Westcott Bakery or can be posted out to you by calling the doctors on 01306 875577 or 01306 881313. Do please respond to this incredibly important means of evidencing to the NHS just how vital the retention of a surgery in Westcott is to the village community and do so by 6th September, which is the cut-off date.

In the meanwhile, the Trustees have now made application through their lawyers to merge the two Charities which form The Reading Room and The Hut. That process has some time



to run, and (importantly) does not yet include any detailed proposals to dispose of the whole or any part of either site.

Once we get to that stage, we will need to go through a consultation exercise with the village and of course such plans as may emerge will be entirely dependent on first having obtained outline planning permission for what is to follow.

And that is really the next phase in the Trustees' endeavours to maximise the community benefit offered by the assets under their control. As, with luck, the NHS approvals start to firm up and as the doctors therefore become able to finance a new surgery , the Trustees will feel more confident in incurring the costs of planning applications and for the design of a new Village Hall. Nothing ventured, nothing gained. It was ever thus.

POLICE INFORMATION ABOUT COVID SCAMMING

Some people are receiving fake text messages claiming they've been in contact with someone who's tested positive for COVID-19. Be aware of a fake SMS text that links to a made-up coronavirus contact tracing service. If you follow the link, the site asks for your personal details.

But there's only one official contract tracing service you can trust, and that's the one being run by the NHS. Its web address is https://contact-tracing.phe.gov.uk.

How to tell if a contact tracing text is real:

NHS Test and Trace might text or call you to warn you if you've recently been in contact with someone who tests positive for the virus.

You can tell if it's genuine if it includes a unique ID number. This ID number should allow you to log into the official Test and Trace website.

Instead of following any links included in the text, go to the website from your web browser and enter the ID number you've been given.

You could also check whether the text came from the only number dedicated to the NHS tracing service, which is 0300 013 5000. However, there are concerns it could be affected by number spoofing. No other messaging services are being used to contact people. If you get a message like this on WhatsApp, Telegram or Facebook, for example, you can be sure it's fake.

Be cautious and report suspicious messages

If you do receive a suspect Test and Trace message, report it to Action Fraud. The National Cyber Security Centre is also encouraging reporting phishing attempts to report@phishing.gov.uk.

Scammers are taking advantage of the pandemic in any way they can to try and steal information and money.

Be generally suspicious of any unusual or unexpected messages that ask for personal information about you or your friends and family.

DORKING MUSEUM



Dorkina is focal point for a September's transatlantic this commemoration of the 400th anniversary of a significant moment in history - the sailing of the Mayflower for the New World in September 1620 - although another significant event, the coronavirus crisis, may mute celebrations a little

although his daughter, Priscilla, is perhaps more celebrated in the US, sometimes known as 'the mother of a nation'. Their imposing house in West Street is the only known surviving home of a 'Pilgrim Father', an attraction for Mayflower tourists from both sides of the Atlantic.

Mullins was not one of the religious separatists who initiated the voyage, but one of the 'Strangers', recruited to fund the crossing. He sailed on the Mayflower with his wife, Alice, daughter Priscilla, son Joseph and servant Robert Carter. The sixth

Dorking voyager was Peter Browne, apprenticed as a weaver in the town and possibly related to the Mullins family.

For their full story, you are encouraged to read the fascinating tale of 'The Weaver, the Shoemaker and the Mother of a Nation: The Story of Dorking's Mayflower Pilgrims' by Kathy Atherton and Susannah Horne, published by The Cockerel Press, available from the Museum online bookshop (dorkingmuseum.org.uk) and local outlets.

Exhibition: With the Museum currently closed, the planned autumn exhibition commemorating the anniversary is being held over until next year. A lot of work has been going on behind closed doors, so it will be well worth

costumes, local saddle maker Julia Forsyth a display of 17th century shoemaking material and tools, and the Dorking Men's Shed a cross section model of the Mayflower and its contents (as well as the magnificent Mayflower planters seen around the town).

BIKE THEFTS



I am sorry to have to add to the news that you've read over previous months about thefts from sheds but bike theft is happening again in the village.

It is really helpful if people have a file with their serial numbers, photos of the bikes, receipts, details like that so maybe do it as soon as you get the

bike, as people often struggle to find that information and it would help to reunite you with your property if the bikes do get recovered or if someone is trying to sell them on. Also you can get bikes security stamped which may deter a prospective thief if you put up a sign to say this has been done.

Keep gates, sheds and garages locked too, and bikes locked up, as anything that makes it harder to access them will also help.

Luckily, one of the latest thefts has been returned - the owner spotted it for sale online on Facebook Marketplace last week and contacted the seller

who gave them the frame reference and his address - as the frame reference matchedthat of the stolen bike the police were contacted and they have done the rest. They brought it back and are continuing their enquiries with the hope of tracing the original thieves (as the seller had unwittingly purchased it from someone else).

NO TIME TO LOSE – a personal perspective

I have lived around the Dorking area all my life and have always felt a deep love for nature, undoubtedly strengthened by childhood walks in the beautiful Surrey Hills, my grandparents' home-grown fruit and vegetables and outdoorsy family holidays in the everchanging British weather.

Until October 2018, when I sat down in the middle of the road outside Parliament, as part of Extinction Rebellion's Declaration of Rebellion. I had always been a law-abiding I have been fortunate to citizen. have a loving family and never had to struggle for the things I need. I have always tried to live in a responsible way but never imagined that one day this would lead me to feel I had no other option but to engage in nonviolent civil disobedience. is the position I have found myself in over the past two years.

Why? Because I have always been told to treat other people as I would like to be treated. Our society is engaged in activities that are causing terrible harm to human, and non-human, life on earth. We are fully aware that these activities are destructive, yet we continue to engage in them. It has become 'normal'. But that does not mean it is right.

The climate and ecological emergency is not 'just another issue' on the news. The science is unequivocal. Our planet is in crisis. This is not just about the environment, this affects everythina. Extinction of species is happening now at an Rising temperatures alarmina rate. and extreme weather events are causing devastation, hunger and conflict in many parts of the world. Human activity is the cause. people who are currently suffering the most - disproportionately people of colour and those affected by poverty - are the ones who are the least responsible. It is unjust.

We need to act now to make radical changes to our society and urgently cut fossil fuel use to reduce carbon emissions. I am human, I am part of nature and I act out of love for all that I hold dear. I am privileged, as a result of an unjust system. I feel there is no other rational option for me but to take part in non-violent civil disobedience - in a similar vein to Gandhi, Martin Luther King, the Civil Rights Movement and the suffragettes - to disrupt the status quo and to try to hasten the change we urgently need.

DORKING CLIMATE EMERGENCY



Dorking Climate Emergency was formed last year with the objectives of firstly keeping everyone informed of matters relating to climate change and secondly to pressure all councils to declare a meaningful emergency. To this end we are a strictly non-party political. Both Surrey County Council and Mole Valley District Council declared a climate emergency last year and we now need to hold them to their promises.

Surrey's declaration promised to make the whole County carbon neutral by 2050. Their recently published document 'Surrey's Greener Future' states how they will do this and Dorking Climate Emergency has studied it carefully. There is much to welcome – for example reducing carbon emissions across the county by 46% in 5 years – but other aspects require serious further consideration.

Read it for yourself on the Surrey County Council website: www.surreycc.gov. uk and search for "Surrey's climate change strategy". You'll find our response on our website: dorking-climate-emergency.net. Click on the text "Response to Surrey County Council's Climate Change Strategy" near the top of the page. We have sent this to all stakeholders and involved Councillors and welcome your comments.

Meanwhile, we are looking forward to the time when lock-down restrictions are lifted sufficiently so we can get together with the Parish Council and various community groups to discuss the consequences of climate change here in rural Surrey. We need a plan to mitigate the problems we, as a community, will be experiencing and some actions will need to be taken very soon.
