... King George VI called for a National Prayer Day in May 1940 to plead for divine intervention as the British Army lay trapped at Dunkirk, facing annihilation.... so widespread and deep was faith in God that literally millions of people flocked into churches to pray.

... Field Marshall Montgomery, on the ending of the war in Europe in 1945, wrote to all his troops, with these words in the opening statement: "We must remember to give praise and thankfulness where it is due. "This is the Lord's doing and it is marvellous in our eyes" (Psalm 118:23)
