THE NEED FOR NUANCE I recently listened to a radio series called 'The Death of Nuance', presented by the psychologist Oliver Burkeman.

Some time ago, Burkeman realised that he was becoming more entrenched in his views and less willing to consider that those he

disagreed with might occasionally have a point – or at least half a point. This troubled him, as did his growing awareness that our society appears to

be becoming less able to entertain the possibility that our 'opponents', however we define them, may not be altogether wrong. It's a possibility that requires us to acknowledge that we may not be altogether right, which is rarely easy.

So Burkeman set out to explore this issue of nuance and why small differences and shades of meaning really matter. In one epsiode, he considers how social media often nudges us into binary or black and white thinking, an 'us and them' mentality in which complex issues are over-simplified, and anyone who thinks the other side might have half a



point is seen as a traitor. At best these exchanges bring us out of our echo chambers; at worst they encourage lazy thinking, unhelpful assumptions and aggressive disagreements. It seems that we are increasingly unable to consider important issues together in a reasonable and civilised way, unwilling to listen and try to understand the viewpoints (and the reasons behind them) of those who see the world differently.

All of this does nothing for our relationships with one another. I

recently heard of someone returning a neighbourly Christmas gift to its giver because they voted for a different political party. The message

was, "We don't take gifts from people like you." That's extreme, I know, but it reflects the way in which differences can become divisions, barriers between us, damaging relationships and communities.





Maybe we need to learn, or relearn, how to disagree well. A series on Premier Radio called 'Unbelievable' provides an excellent model. bringing together two people with apparently opposing worldviews (usually a Christian thinker and someone offering an agnostic or atheistic perspective) to openly discuss their beliefs and experiences. One that springs to mind is an illuminating conversation between Reverend Richard Coles and the illusionist Derren Brown - it's worth a listen. A good conversation on subjects we might previously have been advised to avoid (e.g. religion and politics) can actually help us to learn and grow, as well as revealing what we have in common.

Perhaps unsurprisingly, the people who make up our village church don't all think or believe exactly the same thing. We certainly don't all conform to a type. We're a diverse group, and hopefully our services and activities reflect that. Though at times it might be easier if everyone agreed on everything, it might also become very boring! My personal belief is that God has created every person as a unique individual and delights in our diversity. He also calls us to live and work together in love and unity, accepting one another graciously as he, in Jesus Christ, has accepted us. I'm reminded of the line in a prayer attributed to St Francis of Assisi: "Grant that I may not so much seek ... to be understood as to understand". I can't help wondering what a difference that prayer could make to our homes, our community, our nation and beyond...



The Westcott Village Association Committee is focused on the future and in particular how to ensure the activities of the WVA remain relevant to all Westcott residents. Westcott has a strong identity; it is an attractive place to live, work and raise a family and the WVA want to ensure a positive legacy is left for future generations.

There are four key elements to the WVA's focus on the future;

Membership

Currently membership, voting rights and



subscriptions are all linked. In future it is proposed that everyone in Westcott over 18 automatically becomes a member of the WVA and is encouraged to attend Open meetings and the AGM, where they would have the right to vote on matters affecting the village.

Subscriptions


For the next 2 years it is proposed to trial **a voluntary annual subscription** of £10 so the WVA can continue to provide funds for smaller projects and activities in the village. Street Stewards will be phased out so in time cash contributions will no longer be collected door to door. Donations can be paid on-line via the Village Website and set up as a standing order, with tax payers encouraged to use Gift Aid to boost donations by 25%. Forms for Gift Aid and the Standing Order follow this article and on the Village Website.

Communications

Effective and timely communication is key. In future, as well as regular features in the Village Magazine there will be updates by email and on social media including Facebook, Instagram and Next Door and on the Village Website www.westcottvillage.com To ensure you are included in the WVA Mailing List please send your email to the WVA via contact@westcottvillage.com. Your details will never be passed to a third party and will only be used to communicate village news. You can unsubscribe at any time using the link at the bottom of any email you receive.

Project Funding

of One of the benefits new developments in the village, like the new homes at The Crown, is that the developer has to pay a Community Infrastruture Levy (CIL) to MVDC to fund local infrastructure needs to support growth. There are guidelines on what the CIL can be spent on and while not all projects will be eligible, the WVA can bid for money and are encouraging project ideas, large and

small, to be submitted from across the village. The WVA will sponsor and assist with applications. Further information can be found in the slides presented at the Open Meeting on the 10th March available on the Village Website. A formal motion for the changes will be put to the AGM on the 30th June and if carried will come in to immediate effect.

Looking back the WVA has used its resources to fund smaller projects throughout the village, most of which would not have qualified for CIL funding but nonetheless were deemed important enough to be paid for from WVA funds. In the last two years the WVA has;

• bought speed watch equipment, trained people, and rolled out regular monitoring teams

• supported the Green Westcott group in getting started

agreed the installation of a proper

football goal on Cradhurst

Boundary Commission Review Creates New Ward

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England ("LGBCE") has now released it's proposals on how the electoral patterns for Mole Valley District Council should change from May 2023.

There are changes to every ward in the district and Westcott sees probably the most significant. As forecast, the Council's approach means that Westcott will merge into a large number of other village communities and share three councillors all of whom might live elsewhere and have no underlying knowledge or experience of our community.

The new ward has provisionally been called Leith Hill and would also include all the villages from the south of Leatherhead to the West Sussex border: Mickleham, Westhumble, Ranmore, Abinger Common, Abinger Hammer, Wotton, Forest Green, Okewood Hill and Ockley

There are a couple of points to clarify though. From the existing Leith Hill

ward Coldharbour disappears off to join Beare Green and Holmwoods. The western part of Milton Court leaves Westcott to become Dorking North.



This latest stage of the independent LGBCE review of Mole Valley's electoral ward boundaries sees draft recommendations for changes to the existing local electoral wards in Mole Valley being published for public comment. Visit the LGBCE's website www.lgbce.org.uk for further details on the proposals and to comment on the names of wards and their boundaries. to ensure that councillors will represent about the same number of electors and that ward arrangements help the council work effectively. There are currently 21 wards in Mole Valley. The LGBCE is proposing this changes to 13, three member wards. In their report the LGBCE say that they are aware that they are proposing a ward which is relatively large geographically. In the Council's report, the working group of which I am a part noted this potential ward as "challenging for councillors to cover", given the geographic size.

The LGBCE visited this area on their tour of Mole Valley, including driving from Ranmore Common to Okewood Hill. They consider that, while not on major roads, there are adequate road links between the significant settlements within this proposed ward to enable councillors to visit and represent these communities. They also note that the main A24, while passing through neighbouring wards, enables relatively rapid travel between the northern and southern sections of this proposed ward.

They went on to note that any proposal to split this ward would still result in relatively large wards. Adding that "the existing ward of Westcott would have good equality as a single-member ward, implying that the remaining areas would have to be split into two single member wards on a relatively arbitrary boundary in order to maintain good electoral equality." One possibility for two such neighbouring single members wards that Westcott residents might want to consider would be to split along the boundary of the two parish council wards that Abinger Parish Council uses as this would create District Council wards that are closely matched in electoral voter size to Westcott.

As well as further evidence as to potential boundaries, through responses to the consultation the LGBCE would welcome further evidence as to a potential name for this ward. They propose using the name of Leith Hill, as the dominating geographical feature, but would welcome views on any potential names that strike a

balance between including as many communities as possible and being short enough for convenient use.




What does the review mean for elsewhere in Mole Valley?





Walter Rose and his Photographs 1857 – 1954 – Talk by Keith Harding



Walter Rose and Chicken

At our meeting on 8 March in the St John's Hall 57 people were treated to an excellent talk and slide show about the life and photographs taken by Walter Rose during his photographic heyday before and after 1900.

Walter Rose and his wife Ellen had no children but adopted a niece, Dolly, whose mother had died in childbirth. They lived at No.1 Westcott Street and he took his photographs for local business and land owners,

also venturing to Cornwall, Wales and Derbyshire as well. His photos reflected the people, their activities and buildings of that era. Dolly never married and lived with Uncle Walter and Auntie Ellen until he died in 1954.

She inherited his collection of about 900 glass plate 'negatives' which had been stored for many years in his wooden shed which also served as his 'dark room'. Local historian and friend David Knight, and subsequently Kevin Knight, was asked by Dolly to store the precious plates in his attic and there they remained until 1986 when Keith Harding undertook the task of proof printing the entire collection many of which had not been seen for 90 years. The collection has been catalogued and wherever possible the photos identified in his 'Goodness Gracious Collection', Keith has made them available on his website www. goodnessgracious.co.uk from which they can be purchased.

Keith Harding started his photographic career in 1965 and opened for business as 'Goodness Gracious'. He commenced his talk by demonstrating how a camera on tripod as used by Walter Rose actually

worked. Typically, he carried 6 plates in his leather satchel case and after each treated glass was exposed

it was transferred to a smaller metal container to keep it clean. Then he would take this back to his shed/ darkroom in Westcott Street for processing. The fact that they were stored in his dark shed for some 40 years helped preserve them.

Keith spent some six months digitizing all the photos which are now on his website. This amazing collection records many aspects of Westcott life around 1900. There are views of Westcott Street and the Green, St Johns church and Holy Trinity church and the school also feature. There are many of groups of people at work, at parties and events. The men invariably wore flat hat hats and waistcoats and the women wore long dresses and hats.

We see the old shops such as Balchins, the butcher, and Johnsons as well as well known houses - Bury Hill, before it had the fire, and Rokefield and Milton Court. There are photos of rural life – harvesting grain crops by hand and



youngsters collecting potatoes in buckets as well as children with sheep and farm horses at work.

Imogen Barker, our Chairman, thanked Keith for his interesting talk and congratulated him on all his work in assembling this notable collection of historical photos.



Is the Swift our modern-day canary in the coalmine?



As the middle of summer approaches there are some familiar sounds that confirm its

arrival such as the sound of the swifts as they perform their acrobatics across the sky. These extraordinary little birds spend their life on the wing and migrate huge distances across the globe clocking up a staggering 4 million miles as they move between the UK and Africa. Almost everything they do is performed on the wing – mating, feeding and even sleeping.

When the summer arrives now. you might count yourself lucky to catch just four or five instead of 20, 30 or even 40 swifts diving and soring, twisting and turning above our heads. There has been such a sharp decline in the numbers of swifts, with their numbers down by 53% between 1995 and 2016. Any decline in migrating animals is always a concern, as it indicates problems worldwide. Other notable birds also in decline are the nightingale, the cuckoo and swallows to name but a few. Many of the problems affecting these birds numbers, is due in some part, to habitat loss. Conversion of old buildings has not helped, even

if do they manage to make it to the UK in the first place. Not only are the nesting sites being eradicated and new build houses rarely making provision for these birds to nest, but climatic factors can also not be ignored as a contributing factor to



the decline in numbers, with extreme weather events increasing, these migrating birds have even more to deal with.

But one of the biggest causes of decline in any animal population is always food supply. So what is it that these birds are eating? Insects. Specifically where the swift is concerned they eat flying insects.

When the insect populations diminish it is not rocket science to work out that the species that rely on them for their food, will also begin to decline. More than 40% of insect species are declining and a third are now considered endangered. The rate of extinction is eight times faster than that of mammals, birds and reptiles. One study suggested that the mass of insects is falling by 2.5% a year and go as far as to suggest that they could

all vanish within a century! In Britain, three-quarters of butterfly species have declined over the past 40 years, while moth populations have also fallen by more than 40% in the southern half of the country.

A recent study by the South West Wildlife Trust suggests that the decline in insect numbers is almost certainly due to habitat loss, chronic exposure to mixtures of pesticides, and climate change. They go on to assert that if insect declines are not halted. terrestrial and freshwater ecosystems will collapse, with profound consequences for human wellbeing. Their solution is clear and simple, stop all routine and unnecessary use of pesticides and start to build a nature recovery network by creating more and better connected, insect friendly habitats in our gardens, towns, cities and countryside.

Although we in Westcott may feel we are surrounded by countryside and we don't need to do anything, this could not be further from the truth. Every little bit of countryside needs to be protected if we are to help nature recover from the damage that has already been done. David Attenborough has been quoted as saying, "Every space in Britain must be used to help wildlife". If we take him at his word we can all do some thing to help.

In 2018 the World Wildlife Fund and Zoological Society of London's Living Planet Report [WWF 2018], estimated that the total population of the world's wild vertebrates (fish, amphibians, reptiles, mammals and birds) fell by 60% between 1970 and 2014. Within living memory, more than half of our vertebrate wildlife has been lost. 23 bee and flower-visiting wasp species have gone extinct since 1850 [Ollerton et al. 2014]. These shocking numbers are not only alarming for the species that immediately rely on them for food but they will have an impact on us too.

We rely on nature systems working for our own survival. Three quarters of our human food crops need pollinators to grow, and yet we continue to damage the countryside and the environment around us with the use of pesticides. Whilst the tonnage of pesticides used has gone down over the last 25 years in the UK, the trend is to up the number of applications on an area of land treated and the toxicity of many of these products

has increased [Goulson et al. 2018]. A survey into honey from around the world showed that 75% of those sampled, contained neonicotinoids. Since 1950 it is estimated that in the UK we have lost 150,000 miles of hedgerow, 50% of downland, 98% of wildflower meadows and 50% of ancient woodlands. This will undoubtedly have had an impact on insect populations in the UK. But this is a global issue, deforestation of the Amazon, Congo or South East Asian rain forests will massively have resulted in huge decline in insect species in those areas too.

But you don't need me to tell you that insects are in decline, anyone over the age of 50 will tell you when they were young, how a trip out in the car resulted in constant windscreen washing with all the insect spatter across the glass. Nowadays this is rarely the case. And this is the same the world over. Is it any wonder then, that the likes of our summer swifts are in decline when their food source has been diminishing with such alacrity.



Just as the canary in the coal mine was an early warning system for the miners we might view the swift as our own canary – and if we continue to allow the decline of the insects on our planet we are in danger of dying ourselves.
