Hot liquids	Persons using the chapel, especially children. <b>Risk of scalding</b>	Children should not be allowed in the kitchen when hot drinks are being prepared. The hatchway into the Chapel should be used to pass drinks through to people and not carried out of the kitchen. The door to the kitchen has a closer which may cause people carrying hot drinks to stumble and spill drinks.
