Baby Birds

We spend the spring months listening to birds serenade potential partners with their songs. Over the following few weeks, we can see them in our gardens and greenspaces, flitting back and forth from their nests to bring back food for their chicks. And finally, as late spring arrives, we begin to see the evidence of all their hard work as young birds leave their nest for the first time.

While Robins and Blackbirds can be seen as early as April, many of our other garden visitors like Blue Tits, Starlings and Great Spotted Woodpeckers begin to appear in late May and early June.

You might see fresh fledglings out and about, exploring the world for the first

time, their feathers still downy and the yellow gape peeking from the edge of their beak. At this stage, the fledgling is learning how to live in the outside world without its parents, but its mother will be somewhere nearby, keeping an eagle eye.

It's important to leave a baby bird undisturbed. If you are concerned about the safety of a bird, check out the RSPCA website or the Wildlife Aid Foundation (based in Leatherhead)

WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP



Community Archaeology in Albury Park – the medieval deserted village.

On 11 March we had a thought provoking talk by Dr Anne Sassin, our community archaeologist, about the efforts being made to investigate the medieval settlement along the Tillingbourne Stream through Park. The Domesday Book records this settlement with a church and a mill on the stream. In 1784, Captain William Clement Finch obtained an order to close the road to Shere which ran through the park past the manor house. This began a period of harassment for the villagers, which continued under Charles Wall (1811-1819), who demolished the cottages and moved their occupants to Weston Street - the current Albury - half a mile to the west. By the time of Henry Drummond c.1842, the present New Road from Albury Heath was built, replacing the original Dog Kennel Lane.



The current mansion in Albury Park, assumed to be the site of the medieval manor house, has Tudor origins but was rebuilt in the 17th century. The wooded pleasure grounds and park are thought

to have been planted as early as the 15th century, though the ornamental terraced gardens – for which the site is best known – were designed by John Evelyn in 1667 and have elements including the bath-house, pool and crypta/tunnel still largely intact. The only surviving cottage from the old village is Grange Cottage, at one time the Little George Inn, which has been dendro-dated to the 16th century.



There is little on the ground today to suggest a former village at Albury Park, although landscape clues can give indications of the former settlement. LiDAR (Light Detection and Ranging) uses laser scanning from an aeroplane to create a precise 3D map of the landscape surface. The LiDAR of the park clearly shows not only the former road running through the meadow, but also raised platforms of the former cottages. Following this a magnetometry survey was made in 2023 and 2024 to try and identify attractive spots with potential ancient buried remains where test pits would be dug. About 18 test pits were dug in 2023. The pits were dug one metre

square and excavated in 10cm layers. The early finds included a coin from Edward II in 1300 and a metal 'strap end' from the 14/15 century. as well as an abundance of CBM (ceramic building material). The process was 'dig – sieve – record' down to one metre depth then backfill.



In the following year, 2024, 48 test pits were dug with over 350 volunteer days. Findings included a metal 15th century hinged book clasp and a lot of pottery shards and CBM. This included material

dating back through the 19th century to Medieval, Roman and Prehistoric periods.

Anne Sassin explained that it was planned to continue this research in the summer of 2025 and she was keen to enlist as many helpers as possible. 

There are two orchestral concerts to mention for May:

The Dorking Chamber Orchestra, conducted by Andrew Morley, opens its concert with the overture to *Lucio Silla* by JC Bach, and follows this with two pieces by Mozart – a divertimento and a horn concerto. They then play the *Symphony no.* 3 by Louise Farrenc, a nineteenth-century French composer and pianist whose music has been increasingly heard in recent years.

The Surrey Philharmonic Orchestra, playing in Ashtead, begins with Beethoven's dramatic overture to *Egmont* and follows this with Max Bruch's well-known *Violin Concerto no. 1*, with soloist Joshua Hugo von Bohlen. Then comes Gounod's second symphony, displaying typically French elegance but also some dramatic moments.

series and five rounds Mastermind to her credit makes Chloe a definite must have pub quiz team member. Her quiz master was John Humphrys who said of her "I liked Chloe's technique. There was no nonsense wasting time over questions she did not know the answer to, no. background with Frankie Vaughan's Green Door, the Everley Brothers' Wake Up Little Suzie and Little Donkey by Nina and Frederik as favourites, although her desert island pop discs were Simon and Garfunkel's Bridge Over Troubled Waters and Elvis Presley's Love Me Tender. She was crushed when Elvis married Priscilla as she had rather fancied herself in that role

Not especially enjoying school, Chloe took a secretarial course, and a succession of jobs followed which included working in a book shop, a short stint with the Prospect Theatre Company and au pairing in Germany although she and her fellow au pair spent more time speaking French than learning German. Deciding secretarial work was not really for her, Chloe took 'A' levels by correspondence and got a place at Lady Margaret Hall, one of the first two Oxford colleges to open their doors to women undergraduates. She studied history and dabbled in law and the theatricalities of the bar before taking up teaching at Stanway and Belmont in Dorking and Millais in Horsham.

Ever willing to push the envelope she responded to an ad in the Epsom Labour Exchange to run classes offered by Club Français in a variety of schools. Dual language features in one of her folk choices Ar Hyd y Nos (All Through the Night), the other being the enigmatic Farewell Angelina by Joan

Baez, incidentally the one disc she would rescue from the waves if they were all to be swept away. She was not sure why she would protect this record perhaps saving the puzzling words.

Marriage, motherhood, divorce, a second marriage and widowhood, were further staging posts in Chloe's biography. Her classical category discs are the famous Mozart Horn Concerto and The Pilgrim's Chorus from Wagner's Tannhäuser. The wandering knight of the opera, taking part in a song contest has perhaps some resonances of her life.

Following her retirement from teaching, she makes rather splendid curtains, plays bridge online and with a local club and swims regularly as well as having an ongoing project to declutter in which, by her own admission, she is slowly triumphing. The swimming venue was occasioned by her surprise winning of a free 3 month subscription to a local health club and ever open to opportunity, gave it a go and is still swimming, useful for a castaway. Her luxury is the practical mosquito net if she is to survive a desert island and her book a large dictionary so she can look up all those words she doesn't recognise in the Bible and her copy of Shakespeare, although it's hard to imagine there are many she does not know.

B-Lines – A Network for Pollingtors



Spring and summer would not be complete without the buzz of bees and the delicate

beauty of butterflies. These fascinating creatures are among a richly diverse group of insect pollinators – including hoverflies, moths, wasps, flies, beetles – that play a crucial role in helping the majority of plants, including food crops, produce seeds and fruits.

Pollinators also help create the diversity of wild plants and habitats that support the UK's wildlife, resilience and natural beauty. In turn, these insects themselves are an important source of food for birds, bats and frogs. Sadly over recent years populations of pollinators have been dramatically declining, for reasons including habitat loss, pesticide use, pollution, pests and diseases. The most prominent threat is posed by climate change, as changes in water and temperature can lower the quality and quantity of resources and habitats accessible to pollinators. The drop in the health and populations of bees and other pollinators are threatening biodiversity, food security and human health and wellbeing.

One of the best ways that we can help these creatures, and others that help life thrive, is by creating a welcoming habitat in our homes. In Westcott, we can play a particular role in a nationwide project developed by Buglife to help pollinators – B-Lines – 'an imaginative and beautiful solution to the loss of flowers and pollinators'.

What are B-Lines?

B - Lines are 'insect pathways' running through our



countryside and towns, creating a series of wildflower-rich habitat stepping stones. They link existing wildlife areas together, creating a network, weaving across the UK. This provides large areas of habitat specifically aimed at benefiting bees and butterflies whilst also encouraging other wildlife too. Westcott falls within one of these B-Lines and so we are encouraging everyone to ditch pesticides and grow an array of plants to attract insect pollinators to allow them to thrive and migrate through our village and beyond!

Insect pollinators & how to help them

Most pollination in the UK is performed by bees (wild solitary bees and bumblebees, as well as domesticated honeybees), flies, butterflies, moths, wasps and beetles. Domesticated honeybees are estimated to account for around 5-15% of the UK's insect pollinated crops, but can outcompete

and negatively impact native bees, especially when appropriate food sources are in short supply. Therefore, it is particularly important to provide habitat and plants to support native bees, and other wild insects, that help pollinate the other 85-95%. Leaving areas of gardens undisturbed, hedgerows, rotting wood and compost heaps – can all provide suitable nesting sites for bees. Putting pebbles at the edge of bird baths or ponds can give them a platform from which to drink water.



Around a quarter of the UK's 4,000 native beetle species are pollinators. Delaying cutting back dried

stems of plants until spring can provide nurseries for baby beetles. In the UK we have lost 97% of our wildflower meadows since WWII, due in large part to changing farming practices and land development for building projects. Avoiding cutting areas of lawn and allowing daisies, clover and dandelions grow undisturbed is hugely beneficial for insects. The humble dandelion supports over 50 different species. Importantly, dandelions flower from late March when many insects are emerging from hibernation and provide a vital source of early food. The fluffy seed heads are also enjoyed by birds such as goldfinches and sparrows.

Flowes for pollinators

Diversity and simplicity are key for best supporting a wide range of pollinators. Prioritising a mix of food, herbs and native plants over purely decorative, showy plants (that often complicated petal forms which make it hard for insects to access pollen) will help to encourage beneficial insects. Good plants for pollinators include: apple trees, aster, beans, birds foot trefoil, comfrey, evening primrose, foxglove, grape hyacinth, hawthorn, lavender, mint, nasturtium, oregano, pumpkin/squash, red valerian, scabious, sunflower, thyme, verbena.

Westcott Community Garden will be one of a number of open gardens on Sunday, June



15th for the 'Westcott Open Gardens' event. Of course, the community garden is always open to all, but on that Sunday we will also be promoting the B-Lines project and will hopefully have plenty of pollinator-friendly plants available for people to take back home to help create our B-Line network to benefit these crucial insects.
