





#### DORKING AND DISTRICT RSPB



#### Rare Swallowtails and other Summer **Butterflies**

If you visit East Anglia in early June, you might be treated to a rare sighting of the UK's largest butterfly. Swallowtails in the UK are restricted to the Norfolk Broads (with occasional migrants sometimes turning up further south) where these wet fenlands specialists lay their eggs on Milk Parsley. They overwinter in a chrysalis which can withstand the low temperatures. However, these chrysalises cannot survive prolonged periods of flooding throughout winter, and so populations may be impacted as the climate changes and extreme weather events increase. The butterflies take flight for only a fleeting time, generally three to four weeks, with peak sightings occurring in late May through to June. If you'd like a chance to see one of the UK's rarest butterflies. then RSPB Strumpshaw Fen, one of the few remaining breeding sites, is open for visitors.

If you can't make it to Norfolk, then fear not! Keep your eyes out in your garden or local green space for some summer specialities like Painted Lady, Holly Blue, Small Copper and Marbled White.

# Archbishop George Abbot of Guildford (1562 – 1633)



George Abbot was born in Guildford in Surrey on 29th October 1562. His parents were cloth workers and he had three brothers.

He attended The Royal Grammar School in Guildford and in 1578 went to Balliol College, Oxford to join his brother, Robert - they stayed there for 10 years, both becoming ordained. He must have been an outstanding scholar as he became Master of the University College in 1597 aged He was appointed Dean of 35. Winchester Cathedral in 1600 and he was appointed three times as Vice Chancellor of Oxford University. He played a major part in translating and preparing the authorised version of the New Testament from the original Aramaic and Greek. It was published in 1611 and known as the King James Bible. He was also elected as the Chancellor of Dublin University from 1612 to 1633. His brother Robert became the Bishop of Salisbury and his brother Maurice became the Lord Mayor of London.

In 1608 he went to Scotland with George Home, 1st Earl of Dunbar, to arrange a union between the churches of England and Scotland. This so pleased King James that George Abbot was made Bishop of Lichfield and Coventry and was later translated to be the Bishop of London. The King made Abbot the Archbishop of Canterbury in 1611 and Guildford celebrated the 400th anniversary of the St James Bible in 2011. He was described as being a sincere but rather narrow minded Calvinist.

Two attempts were made to assassinate Abbot. The first was in 1614 when a man rushed into his study waving a knife while Abbot was writing. Abbot stopped him and the man was put in the stocks and then imprisoned. Four years later there was another attempt to assassinate Abbot but the attacker was apprehended and put in the Tower of London. In due course he was released and banished. July 1621 Archbishop George Abbot, while hunting on horseback in Bramshill in Hampshire shot a bolt from his crossbow, aimed at a deer, that accidentally happened to strike one of the keepers who died within an hour. Abbot was very distressed and fell into a state of melancholia. The Kina set up a commission of ten to review the incident, which was equally divided but the King voted in Abbot's favour and signed a formal pardon. After this incident Abbot rarely appeared at Court though he did perform the coronation service of Charles I in 1625. He lived in retirement in his last years.

## WESTCOTT HISTORY GROUP (cont.)



As Archbishop and defender of the Catholic nature of the priesthood, he was harsh in his treatment of Roman Catholics and often showed courageous resistance to the royal 'will'. At the Archbishop's Palace in Croydon he forbade the reading of the Declaration of Sports which listed the permitted Sunday recreations. He was a promoter of the match between the King's daughter, Princess Elizabeth and Frederich 5th, Elector of Palatine and he was a firm opponent of the projected marriage of the Prince of Wales (to be Charles I) and the Spanish Infanta, Maria Anna. This policy brought Archbishop Abbot the hatred of William Laud, with whom he had been in collision at Oxford and also at the King's Court.

Abbot was a conscientious prelate though narrow in view and harsh towards Catholics. He had endowed Abbot's Hospital with land valued at £300 per year. Guildford remembers Archbishop Abbot with his hospital, a statue on the High Street and the school of 2000 pupils in Burpham. His tomb is in Holy Trinity Church, Guildford where his death is inscribed as 4th August 1633.

William Laud was a Bishop in the Church of England appointed by Charles I in 1633 (following Abbot) and was a keen advocate of Charles' religious reforms. However in 1640 he was arrested by Parliament, accused of treason and executed under a Bill of Attainder

(conviction for high treason) on Tower Hill on 10th January 1645 towards the end of the first English Civil War. Laud believed in rule by Bishops, emphasizing liturgical ceremony and clerical hierarchy enforcing uniformity in the Church of England, nowadays known as 'high church'. He was accused of 'arminiarism' favouring doctrines of the historic church and defending the continuity of the English Church with the primitive medieval and opposing Calvinism. He was regarded by Puritan clerics as a danaerous and formidable opponent. His use of the Star Chamber to persecute opponents made him very unpopular.

Laud was 60 years old when he became Archbishop of Canterbury, having waited a decade to replace George Abbot. The Emeritus Professor at Cambridge, Patrick Collinson, an expert on Elizabethan Puritans, in 1980 published this rebuke of Laud: the greatest calamity ever visited on the English Church – give great praise to the Lord and little Laud to the devil. Laud was known to be touchy about his diminutive stature.


#### Abinger Medieval Fair



# WESTCOTT VILLAGE FORUM

### Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan – a Community Survey question relating to Westcott becoming a Parish Council:


In July, a Community Survey will be circulated asking all residents their views on a number of matters as a base for the Village Forum to prepare an updated Neighbourhood Development Plan. Included in that survey will be a question about whether residents want to explore becoming a Parish Council given County Council restructuring. Many communities where unitary authorities are being proposed are asking the same question and in order to start the process at least 250 adult residents need to agree they want a Parish Council.

You might already be aware that in response to Central Government prompts, Surrey County Council is looking to change the way the county is governed. The proposals, submitted on 9th May, seek to create two Unitary Authorities to replace both Surrey County Council and the eleven District and Borough Councils operating in Surrey - including Mole Valley District Council. It seems likely that all public services for Westcott Residents will be managed by one of the two new Unitary Authorities, probably a new East Surrey Council.

Westcott has had a Village Association for 45 years which has tried to represent the village when important matters

affecting residents arise. However, a Village Association is only ever advisory and does not have the formal administrative, enforcement or legal powers that a Parish Council enjoys. Removing Mole Valley District Council could seriously impact what and how services are provided in the village. Becoming a Parish Council has been discussed in Westcott in the past, but with a much flatter, revised local government structure it could become the best way to ensure proper consultation and involvement in local public service provision. Most Parish Councils would argue that they can be more effective than a Village Association because:

- 1. Parish Councils have elected officials who have statutory powers and are accountable to the whole community.
  2. Parish Councils have legal and financial status which allows them to set budgets, enter into contracts and organise things at a local level to best suit their local community.
- 3. Parish Councils can set a precept on the rates usually in the region of £20-30 per annum per household to operate services locally, and receive delegated finances from what will be the Unitary Authority, to cover the cost of maintaining village assets. For Westcott for instance, these assets could include Cradhurst recreation ground, the village green, village footpaths and the dovecote bus shelter.
- 4. Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL)

monies raised from developers within a Parish Council boundary is given directly to that Parish Council to fund local community projects. Village Associations have no such rights, so monies raised from developers go into a pot which is distributed by an outside Committee of Councillors who decide what to spend it on. Of around £160,000 CIL recently awarded in Mole Valley none of that money was spent on Westcott even though the Crown development had generated a

significant proportion of the total fund.

Local Government reorganisation will take some time to achieve but so would a process to assess whether Westcott should consider setting up a Parish Council. As noted above, your answers in the July survey will determine whether this process should be started now.

# Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan (WNDP)

Another productive Westcott Village Forum



meeting was held at the end of May. The Village Forum is made up of over 100 people who have stepped forward from right across the village to oversee the updating of this Plan. The various working groups have been busy and the next key activity is undertaking a Community Survey which will be sent to every household in the Neighbourhood Area (Westcott and some areas beyond) at the end of June. This survey has been designed to capture your views on a variety of topics, to find out what is important to you and what you would like to see improved and to ask you for your thoughts for the future of our local area.

The outcomes of the survey will be used by the Westcott Village Forum and its working groups to shape the policies within an updated Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan. Survey replies are needed from as many residents as possible, please complete the survey online if possible or paper copies can be provided on request. Details of how to access the survey are included on the flyer which has been delivered with this magazine and can also be found on the Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan pages of the Westcott Village website

Once updated, the draft WNDP checked and verified by Independent Inspector, then Local Authority will organise a public referendum (vote) so that everyone who lives within the Neighbourhood Area can decide whether they support it or not. The target is to hold this referendum in May 2026 to coincide with Polling Stations being open for local government elections. Once agreed, the WNDP forms part of the statutory development plan for the area and sitting alongside the Mole Valley District Council Local Plan, it is referred to when the considering outcome anv plannina application in the Neighbourhood Area. the likely changes in local government structures, it is important that we take the opportunity to update the Westcott Neighbourhood Development Plan now. ### **PORKING WELCOMES REFUGEES**

The people of Dorking and the surrounding villages have aiven generous support to those in need on many occasions. But there have been clashes of culture between residents and incomers. and sometimes demands on scarce resources have given rise to conflict. The Museum's summer exhibition, A Place of Safety, tells the stories of the various groups



of refugees who have found refuge in the town and their experiences.

It starts with the eminent group of émigrés fleeing the French Revolution in 1792 and taking up residence in Juniper Hall on the slopes of Box Hill. In the 20th century, they were followed by those fleeing the Kaiser's army in 1914,

Nazi oppression in the late 1930s, and the Blitz in 1940. The work of the Dorking Refugee Committee, in which Ralph Vaughan Williams was a leading



voice, is featured. The story continues in the present century with refugees from war and persecution in the Middle East. The treasures on show include the Dorking Nursery Scrapbook from the 1940s, showing the experiences of those bombed out of their homes, and four beautifully detailed dolls, made by Mickleham and Westhumble WI in the 1970s and representing the high-profile French émigrés of the 18th century.

Family Activities at Dorking Library: In conjunction with Dorking Library, on Saturday 21st June, 10am to noon, for Gypsy, Roma and Traveller Month, there will be an opportunity for families to come to the Library, sort photos of old transport and make a card where the gypsy caravan moves along the road. A free event, with materials provided, aimed at 4–11-year-olds, children must be accompanied.

Walking in Dorking: Take advantage of the summer weather and explore the area's magnificent heritage with the Museum's popular programme of guided walks. On the edge of town, a Betchworth Castle tour includes exclusive access to the Castle enclosure, the romantic ruin of the only remaining fortified medieval manor house in Surrey: Sunday 8th June, 2pm, from the entrance to Betchworth Park Golf Club.
